Descriptive Note: Wilburn Leon Amos was born in 1910 in Louisiana. He married

Helen Warf Amos of Reidsville, NC in 1942. They owned 3 tracts of land off Groom's Road near Reidsville. Wilburn served in the U.S. Army in North Africa and Italy during World War II. While overseas, Wilburn wrote many postcards home to Helen, including one in 1944 where he stated, "Dear I would love for you to save all these cards that I am sending." After the war, they resided in Reidsville where Wilburn was employed by C. W. McCoy Plumbing and Heating. Wilburn

died in 1971 and Helen died in 1983. Both are buried at

Reidlawn Cemetery in Reidsville.
