Descriptive Note: Collection of letters, photos, business papers and receipts

relating to the Richardson, Millner and Watt families.

Family Information: Triplett "Trip" Estes Richardson was born in 1851 in Christian

County, KY. He married Tallulah A. Lea of Caswell County, NC. They had 2 daughters, Susie E. Richardson and Margaret "Madge" Richardson. Trip was a tobacco salesman for A. H. Motley & Co. in Reidsville, NC and he travelled extensively, spending a large amount of time in Mississippi and other

states.

In 1890, Trip and Tallulah began construction of a large Victorian style home at 312 S. Main Street in Reidsville. The house was designed by architects Epps & Hackett, who also designed several of the buildings at Duke University in

Durham. Construction was completed in 1891 and furnishings were purchased from Tom Terry & Co. of Reidsville. A new piano was purchased from M. B. Ramos & Co. of Richmond, VA.

Susie and Madge both attended Salem Academy in Winston-Salem, NC, returning home often for holidays and social events. In 1900, Susie married James Sloan of Winston-Salem, where they resided. Susie was employed by her alma mater, Salem Academy and James was a bookkeeper in a tobacco factory. Three years later, in 1903, Madge married Wallace Millner and the couple moved in with Millner's parents until acquiring their own home in Reidsville.

Wallace and Madge had 3 children, James Estes Millner who went by his middle name, Wallace B. Millner, Jr., and Margaret L. Millner. The Millner family moved into the Richardson home with Trip and Tallulah at 312 S. Main Street in 1908. Soon after, in 1909, Tallulah passed away. Trip continued to live in the house with his daughter's family until he passed away in 1926.

Wallace Millner, Sr. passed away in 1950. Madge continued to live in the home with her oldest son, Estes, until she passed away in 1965. Estes then lived in the house until he passed away in 1997. At that time the house passed out of the Richardson-Millner family.
