WHAT CAN I STUDY AT RCC?

COLLEGE TRANSFER PROGRAMS

Associate in Arts/Science/ Fine Arts Degree

These AA/AS/AFA degrees are designed for students wishing to transfer to a four-year university, and represent completion of approximately half of a bachelors degree program. The degrees require approximately 64 semester hours and can typically be completed within two years by full-time students.



CAREER & TECHNICAL PROGRAMS

Associate in Applied Science (AAS Degree)

These degrees provide extensive entry-level employment training in professional fields. AAS degrees range from 64 to 76 semester hours and can typically be completed within two years by full-time students.

Diploma

Diploma programs provide entry-level employment training in fields that require less extensive training than an AAS degree. These programs range from 36 to 48 semester hours and can usually be completed by full-time students within two semesters and one summer session.

Certificate

A certificate provides entry-level employment skills and is often a way to get specific training in an area related to a diploma or AAS degree. These programs range from 12 to 18 semester hours and can usually be completed within one semester.

Advanced Emergency Medical Technician

NEW!

The primary focus of the Advanced EMT is to provide basic and limited advanced emergency medical care and transportation for critical and emergent patients who access the emergency medical system. This individual possesses the basic knowledge and skills necessary to provide patient care and transportation.

Advanced Emergency Medical Technicians function as part of a comprehensive EMS response, under medical oversight. Advanced Emergency Medical Technicians perform interventions with the basic and advanced equipment typically found on an ambulance. The Advanced Emergency Medical Technician is a link from the scene to the emergency health care system. NC fee-exempt status applies; however additional fees and books are the responsibility of the student. Graduates from this program will be able to take the North Carolina and National Registry AEMT Cognitive Exam.

Emergency Medical Technician Initial

The EMT program is designed to teach basic life support skills. EMTs are able to function in many areas including EMS systems, fire departments, hospitals, rescue squads and physician offices. The class consists of lectures and hands-on skills instruction as well as field clinical opportunities. Upon successful completion of this course, students will be eligible to sit for the North Carolina or National Registry EMT examination. Prices below include tuition as well as additional fees of clinical uniform shirts, HCP CPR card fee, and malpractice insurance. North Carolina tuition exemption status does apply; however additional fees and books are the responsibility of the student. Paramedic Initial

This program meets National Standard Curriculum. The program provides the knowledge, skills and attributes to provide advanced emergency medical care as a paramedic for critical and emergent patients who access the emergency medical system, and prepares graduates to enter the workforce. Students will gain complex knowledge, competency, and experience while employing evidence-based practice under medical oversight, and serve as a link from the scene into the healthcare system. Employment opportunities include providers of emergency medical services, convalescent ambulance services, fire departments, rescue agencies, hospital specialty areas, industry, educational and government agencies. Class includes lectures, hands-on skills instruction, and field clinical opportunities. Upon

successful completion of this course, students will be eligible to sit for the North Carolina State Paramedic examination. Students must be certified as a North Carolina or National Registry EMT. NC fee-exempt status applies; however additional fees and books are the responsibility of the student. Central Sterile Processing

This program prepares students for the field of Sterile Processing and Central Service Supply. Students will develop skills necessary to properly disinfect, prepare, process, store, and issue both sterile and non-sterile supplies and equipment for patient care. Students will also learn to operate sterilizing units and monitor effectiveness of the sterilization process. Graduates will receive a certificate and may be eligible to apply to take the National Institute for Certification of Healthcare Sterile Processing and Distribution Personnel Examination (CBSPD). Employment opportunities include surgery centers, dialysis facilities, and central processing units in hospitals.

This program provides skills training in three competency areas related to the job performance for medical assistants: administrative office, laboratory, and clinical. Course work includes instruction in scheduling appointments, insurance coding and billing, medical transcription, computer operations, assisting with examinations/treatments, performing routine laboratory procedures, and ethical/legal issues associated with patient care. Upon completion, students will have the knowledge base to apply for national certification as a Medical Assistant.

Nurse Aide

This program is designed to prepare graduates to provide personal care and perform basic nursing skills for the elderly and other adults. Emphasis on aging process including mental, social and physical needs of the elderly, patients' rights, nutrition management, elimination procedures, safe environment, restorative services, personal and special care procedures and activities, human body structure and function and related common disease/disorders, communication and documentation, death and dying, and roles of the nursing assistant and health team members. A skill/competency evaluation is required. The course includes class, laboratory and clinical learning experiences. Upon satisfactory completion of the course and skill/competency evaluation, the graduate is eligible to apply for listing as a Certified Nurse Aide I by the N.C. Division of Facility Services.

Pharmacy Technician

This program provides instruction in accordance with the guidelines of the Pharmacy Technician Certification Board (PTCB) on topics applicable to medications, patient safety and quality assurance, order entry and processing, and federal requirements related to pharmacy practice. Through an in-depth integrated curriculum, students learn what is required to work in both retail and institutional pharmacy settings to safely dispense medication to patients under the supervision of a licensed pharmacist. Students successfully completing the program receive certificates and will be eligible to take the Pharmacy Technician Certification Exam (PTCE). Upon achieving a passing score on the PTCE, PTCB will award the Certified Pharmacy Technician credential, CPhT, a professional credential recognized throughout the practice of pharmacy. First Aid

The American Heart Association HeartSaver First Aid is a classroom, video-based, instructor-led course that teaches critical skills to respond to and manage an emergency in the first few minutes until emergency services (EMS) arrives. Students learn skills such as how to treat bleeding, sprains, broken bones, shock and other first aid emergencies. When the course is completed, students receive an AHA First Aid recognition card that is valid for 2 years. There are no fee exemptions and First Aid card fees are included in the cost. *Pre-payment and preregistration is required no later than three business days prior to the class.* **AHA First Aid Cards are now eCards; you must have an email address to access your card.** To preregister, call Donna Thompson at 336-342-4261 x2602.

Are you seeking an alternative to classroom training or wishing to renew an existing AHA certification? The eLearning online course offers a flexible training option. The online cognitive portion, provided by AHA, allows students to complete learning at their own pace and convenience. Students should schedule a Skills Practice and Testing session prior to taking the online cognitive portion. Once students complete the online cognitive portion, they must attend scheduled hands-on skills practice and testing session to complete their certification. During this session students will have the opportunity for one-on-one practice before a skill test with a certified AHA instructor. Upon successful completion of these parts students will be proficient in the required skills and will receive a certification in the associated discipline. The student will need to bring the eLearning certificate to the appointment along with a valid email address for the certificate. **AHA CPR Cards are now eCards; you must have an email address to access your card.** Appointment times are Monday/Wednesday 9-5; Tuesday/Thursday 9-7 and Friday 9-12. Sustainable Trail Management, Assessment, Permitting, and Contracting

During this two-day **intermediate** trail training session, participants learn about the comprehensive management of natural surface trails. Students discuss trail assessment, trail facilities, signage, maintenances, wet weather trail closure, and other current issues. Classroom teaching and experiential learning are combined to help students understand critical trail assessment. Participants begin by discussing how trail condition, maintenance, and safety can affect the "trail experience," and they conduct a desktop trail system review. Students also learn how the interpretation of assessment results may vary depending on user group and trail difficulty. The session covers potential permitting requirements and trail contracting for natural surface sustainable trail projects based on assessment results. Participants gain field experience assessing existing trails and proposed reroutes on the RCC trail system. Fieldwork also

includes a site visit to a local trail system to evaluate sustainable trail management topics. Students should bring their own lunch, snacks, and plenty of drinking water. Participants must dress appropriately for hiking – long pants and closed-toe shoes (boots preferred), and be prepared to hike 3-6 miles over the course of two days.

Students need wood for projects. Discussion is held at the beginning of class about what types of wood would work best for each student's project and guidance is provided about obtaining wood. The quantity and purchase amount will vary per student and per project but will cost \$50 or less. The Center for Creative Woodworking has poplar wood for purchase. If students

prefer wood other than poplar, it may be purchased elsewhere. Please call the instructor at 336-394-4718 for recommendations. Some students prefer to bring in wood from other sources, such as an old home place or a fallen tree. However, neither Rockingham Community College staff nor the Center for Creative Woodworking staff will cut down trees or retrieve fallen wood from private community members. Wood obtained from anywhere other than the CCWW must be inspected and approved by the instructor. Class will meet during Fall Break (week of Oct. 14). \$20 supply fee included.

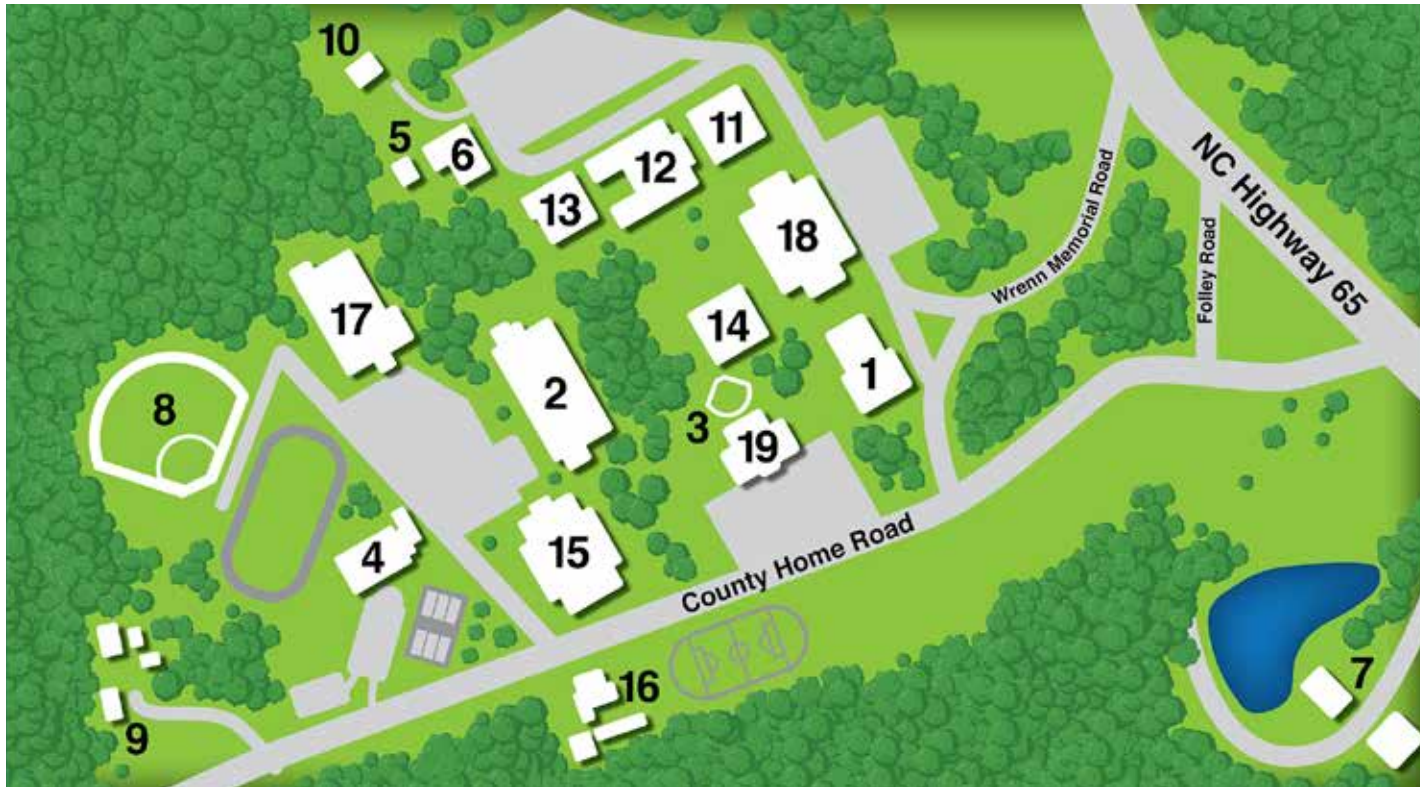
