

Accounting Basics

This course is designed for students who have little or no accounting knowledge. Topics include the accounting cycle, journal entries, T-accounts, adjusting entries, and financial accounting statements. Pre-payment is required.

E-Notary

This 3-hour electronic notary course is designed for individuals who want to become commissioned as an electronic notary. Electronic Notarization is the process of applying an electronic notary signature and seal onto an electronic document in a completely electronic and paperless transaction. Although a number of technological tools are used, the process maintains the safeguards of the traditional notarization process. Topics covered in this class include legal, ethical and procedural requirements of the Notary Act. Upon completion of this course with a passing exam grade of 80%, a person is eligible to make application with the NC Secretary of State office. **Please arrive 30 minutes early to this Electronic Notarization class to allow time for check-in.* You must hold a valid commission as a notary public in the state of North Carolina in order to take this class. What to bring with you to class: (1) Your Notary ID number, (2) Your current state or federal issued photo ID, (3) Your Notary Public 11th Edition manual, and (4) cash or check in the amount of \$7.00 to purchase your Electronic Notarization Manual (instructor cannot process debit or credit cards).*

Intro to Spanish

No hablo espanol! No Problem! Students will learn to converse in this Intro to Spanish class in a variety of social and cultural situations. Understand the spoken and written Spanish language of daily life for introductions and greetings. This course is for beginning language students (no prior knowledge of Spanish is required).

Lean Office

Learn the basic concepts of Lean and transform your office environment. Through an engaging office simulation and examples, this course helps participants learn to identify waste in everyday work. Waste includes: long customer response times, queued work, excessive hand-offs, poor communication. The class is designed for activities common to knowledgeable workers. It introduces various tools to achieve lean office practices and presents ways to promote sustainable implementation.

Notary Public

Students learn the requirements and qualifications of the notary public office. NC notaries must have a high school diploma or GED; must be at least 18 years old; read, write, and speak English and have no felony convictions. Prepayment and purchase of <u>Notary Book</u> <u>11th Edition</u> are required.

QuickBooks Desktop 2018

This course will introduce students to QuickBooks' essential skills. Students will experience hands-on learning of computer applications in these areas: Introducing QuickBooks Pro, Creating and Editing Customers and Adding Jobs, Working with Vendors, Moving Funds between Accounts and Planning and Creating a Company.

Students in Draw Like an Artist will cover subjects needed to become a sketch artist and will keep a sketch diary. Topics will include fore shortening, composition, perspective, and color mixture. Needed supplies are a spiral bound sketch pad, drawing pencils, an eraser, and a sponge to clean your table workspace. *Supplies extra*.

Fundamentals of Stained Glass

This Fundamentals of Stained Glass course is designed to teach the art of stained glass making at an introductory level. Course work will include discussion on the history and trends of the art, practice in the art of stained glass making, and information about building and supplying a studio. Students need to obtain the following materials: glass cutter, glass pliers, glass foil, solder, soldering iron, rheostat, and workboard. *Supplies extra*.

Painting a Rainy Night in Paris NEW!

Students will learn how to create an acrylic painting featuring new concepts and techniques leading to a background of color brushstrokes with a scene of rain reflecting on a street lighted path. *Supplies extra*.

Painting a Waterscape Boat Scene NEW!

Students will learn how to create an acrylic landscape of a NC fishing area with boats. Topics covered will include foreshortening, composition, perspective, and color mixture. *Supplies extra*.

Fine Points of Furniture Construction

The Fine Points of Furniture Construction course is designed to cover the heritage of the art of woodworking at an advanced level. Coursework will include discussion on the history, trends, and practice of the art plus information about building and supplying a studio. Upon completion, students will be prepared to either advance to a higher skill level or to fabricate and market their goods. Students will need wood for projects. Wood obtained from anywhere other than the CCWW (Center for Creative Woodworking) must be inspected and approved by the instructor. *Must have taken the Fundamental Woodworking class prior to enrolling in this class.*

Fundamentals of Woodturning – Sessions #1 and #2

The Fundamentals of Woodturning workshop offered on Saturdays is an abbreviated version of the eight-week turning class. Students will turn wood with a focus on safety, tools, sharpening, chucks, and techniques. Several projects will be covered demonstrating a variety of aspects of turning. The instructor will provide the students with wood and any other needed supplies for the workshop. \$20.00 supply fee is included in the cost of this workshop.

Fundamentals of Woodworking

The Fundamentals of Woodworking course is designed to cover the heritage of the art of woodworking at an introductory level. Course work will include discussion on history and trends, practice, and information to building and supplying a studio. Upon completion, students will be prepared to either advance to a higher skill level or to fabricate and market their goods. Discussion is held at the beginning of class about what types of wood would work best for each student's project and guidance is provided about obtaining wood. The quantity and purchase amount will vary per student and per project. The Center for Creative Woodworking has poplar wood for purchase. If students prefer wood other than poplar, it may be purchased elsewhere. Please call the instructor at 336-394-4718 for recommendations. Some students prefer to bring in wood from other sources, such as an old homeplace or a fallen tree. Wood obtained from anywhere other than the CCWW must be inspected and approved by the instructor.

Intermediate Woodworking

The Intermediate Woodworking course is designed to cover the heritage art of woodworking at the intermediate level. Course work will include discussion on history and trends, practice, and information to build and supply appropriate studios. Upon completion, students will be prepared to either advance to a higher skill level or to fabricate and market their goods. Students will need wood for projects. Wood obtained from anywhere other than the CCWW must be inspected and approved by the instructor. *Must have taken the Fundamental Woodworking class prior to enrolling in this class.*

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Arts & Crafts Woodworking/Woodturning

Intro to Bowls

This Intro to Bowls class will show students the basics of woodturning a unique bowl. This class is open to woodturners of all skill levels. Topics will include safety, tool selection, wood selection (green wood vs. dry), finishing, and coloring and texturing as time permits. Students will need a 6" x 6" x 2" or 6" x 6" x 3" piece of wood (known as a "blank"), as well as sandpaper. These items will cost approx. \$20 and can be purchased from Wall Lumber, online, or from the instructor at the beginning of class.

Intro to Platters

Learn the fundamentals of turning a wooden platter. Create gifts for loved ones or for your own enjoyment. Students will use bowl turning, spindle turning and scraping tools to create a platter of their own design. Focus will be placed on safety and basic techniques. This class is open to woodturners of all skill levels. Students will need a 12" x 12" x 2" piece of wood (known as a "blank") which is either solid or glue-up, as well as sandpaper. Bring wood to the Woodworking Center on Friday, Feb. 1 at 6 p.m. for glue-up if necessary. These items will cost approx. \$30 and can be purchased from Wall Lumber, online, or from the instructor at the beginning of class.

Make a Cutting Board

Learn how to make a unique cutting board using woodshop tools. This class is open to students of all skill levels. Topics will include wood and glue selection, food reactions to various woods, shaping, finishing, and maintaining your one-of-a-kind cutting board. Students should bring wood for the cutting board; thickness should be at least 3/4" (NO Oak). Wood may be purchased from Wall Lumber, online, or from the instructor or the student may bring wood of sentimental value. Instructor must approve of wood before use.

Pen Turning

Learn how to make a unique ink pen using woodshop tools. This class is open to students of all skill levels. Students will need wood or acrylic for making their pen – measurements should be approx. $\frac{3}{4}$ " x $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 6" and this item is known as a "blank." A blank will cost no more than \$15 and can be purchased from Wall Lumber, Woodcraft, online, or you may bring a blank which holds meaning for you (perhaps from an ancestral home). The instructor must approve all blanks brought into the Woodworking Center.

Turn a Pepper Mill

Learn to make your own pepper mill – a "must" for backyard cookouts – during a Saturday at our Center for Creative Woodworking. Students will need a 3" x 3" x 12" piece of wood (known as a "blank"), a peppermill insert, and a sandpaper; these items will cost approx. 20 and can be bought from Pennstate Industries, Woodcraft, a Woodturner catalog, or at our Woodworking center at the beginning of class.



Learn how to make a unique wine bottle stopper using woodshop tools. Students will need wine bottle stopper hardware if metal components are wanted; if only a cork is used, there are no supplies to bring. Wine bottle stopper hardware may be purchased for \$8.00 and up from Pennstate Industries, Woodcraft, or from the instructor at the beginning of class.

Wind Twirler – It's a Breeze! NEW!

Learn to make a beautiful handmade wooden wind twirler, a meaningful gift for loved ones or a pleasure to watch on your own front

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porch, at a Saturday workshop at our Center for Creative Woodworking. The instructor will provide the students with wood and any other needed supplies for the workshop. Students will need a weather-stable wooden board approx. $\frac{1}{2}$ " thick, which can be purchased for around \$20 from Wall Lumber or at our Woodworking Center.

Woodturning Studio

Woodturning Studio students have access to RCC's Center for Creative Woodworking to work on independent projects or learn something new. Beginners or continuing woodturning students are welcome. The instructor and CCWW staff will be available to work with students closely to instruct on specific techniques and answer questions. Students will have learned about the type and quantity of wood needed while completing the Fundamentals class. Wood obtained from anywhere other than the CCWW must be inspected and approved by the instructor. Students will need wood, sandpaper, and finish. These items will cost approximately \$100 and can be purchased from Wall Lumber, Lowes, online, or from the instructor at the beginning of class.

Basic Motorcycle Safety

Motorcycle riding fundamentals and safety are addressed with classroom training and 15 hours of riding time. Classroom and range attendance are mandatory. Students need a DOT approved helmet (provided if rider does not have his/her own), eye protection (glasses or goggles), over-the-ankle footwear (cloth or canvas not accepted), long sleeve shirt or jacket, long denim pants without flared hem, and full-finger gloves.

OBD / IM Emissions Training

This course prepares auto technicians and service personnel to be safety and emissions inspectors for motor vehicles. It includes regulations and test inspection procedures. Students are taught to inspect a vehicle and gain the skills necessary to pass the qualification exams for certification as a safety and emissions inspector at a licensed inspection station.

Vehicle Safety Inspection

This course teaches the proper procedures for conducting vehicle safety inspections. Information on the operation of a safety inspection station is included.

Comp TIA Network+ & Security+ NEW!

This course is designed to prepare students for employment as an entry-level computer support professional. This course provides a basic knowledge of computer hardware, software, and operating systems who wish to increase their knowledge and understanding of networking concepts and acquire the required skills to prepare for a career in network support or administration, or who wish to prepare for the CompTIA Network⁺ N10-007 certification exam.



After taking this course, students will understand the field of network security and how it relates to other areas of information technology with the current CompTIA Security⁺ SY0-501 certification exam.

This course also provides the broad-based knowledge necessary to prepare for further study in specialized security fields, or it can serve as a capstone course that introduces the field.

Badminton

This course covers the fundamentals of badminton. Emphasis is placed on the basics of serving, clears, drops, drives, smashes, and the rules and strategies of singles and doubles. Upon completion, students should be able to apply these skills in playing situations.

Beginning Tennis

This course emphasizes the fundamentals of tennis. Topics include basic strokes, rules, etiquette, and court play. Upon completion, students should be able to play recreational tennis.

Circuit Training

This course covers the skills necessary to participate in a developmental fitness program. Emphasis is placed on the circuit training method which involves a series of condition timed stations arranged for maximum benefit and variety. Upon completion, students should be able to understand and appreciate the role of circuit training as a means to develop fitness.

Physical Fitness I

This basic Physical Fitness course provides an individualized approach to physical fitness utilizing the five major components of cardiovascular endurance, muscular strength, muscular endurance, flexibility, and body composition. Emphasis is placed on the scientific basis for setting up and engaging in personalized physical fitness programs.

Walking for Fitness

This course introduces fitness through walking. Emphasis is placed on stretching, conditioning exercises, proper clothing, fluid needs, and injury prevention. Upon completion, students should be able to participate in a recreational walking program. Students are required to purchase a pedometer and a textbook.

Weight Training I

This course introduces the basics of weight training. Emphasis is placed on developing muscular strength, muscular endurance, and muscle tone. Upon completion students should be able to establish and implement a personal weight training program. Textbook required.

Because physical exercise can be strenuous and subject to risk of serious injury, students are encouraged to obtain medical clearance from a doctor before using any exercise equipment or participating in any physical activity.

Cardiovascular Technician

This program prepares students to become certified EKG Technicians. Students will learn the anatomy and physiology of the heart, including the electrical conduction system and how it affects heart function. This course also covers the cardiac cycle, common artifacts, and cardiac terminology. Students will also learn how to prepare patients, properly place leads, as well as mount and run an EKG strip correctly. This program will prepare students for the Certified EKG Technician (CET) Exam through the National Healthcareer Association (NHA).

Certified Medical Reimbursement Specialist

As part of the Certified Medical Reimbursement Specialist training program, students will complete the Certified Medical Reimbursement Specialist Examination offered through the American Medical Billing Association. The completion of this certificate option prepares individuals for entry level positions in a medical office with responsibilities in billing and medical reimbursement. Portions of this class are online. Scholarship assistance is available for the additional \$260.00 certification exam and study guide. There are no pre-requisite courses but some work experience is highly recommended.



Lean Office

Learn the basic concepts of Lean and transform your office environment. Through an engaging office simulation and examples, this course helps participants learn to identify wastes in everyday work. Waste includes: long customer response times, queued work, excessive hand-offs, poor communication. The class is designed for activities common to knowledgeable workers. It introduces various tools to achieve lean office practices and presents ways to promote sustainable implementation.

Nurse Aide Level I

Nurse Aides are a vital contributor to patient care for patients in nursing homes, hospitals, home health, and physicians offices. Nurse Aides help minimize the stress of those who are sick or unable to care for themselves and their family members. Upon completion, students will be eligible to sit for state approved Nurse Aide I competency testing to become a Certified Nurse Aide I and listing on the Nurse Aide I Registry.

Pharmacy Technician Training

Topics in this Pharmacy Technician class include the laws applicable to pharmacy practice, pharmaceutical calculations, pharmacology, drug dispensing and labeling (retail and hospital settings), controlled substance procedures, sterile and non-sterile compounding, and inventory control. This class is designed to teach the student how to prepare and dispense prescribed drugs in hospitals and retail settings under the supervision of a registered pharmacist. **This course consists of traditional and online instruction.** A math pre-test is **REQUIRED** and must be completed by January 16, 2019. Call 336-342-4261 ext. 2225 to schedule your pre-test. This course will help prepare the student to take the National Pharmacy Technician Certification Exam (PCTE). Textbook and workbook required.


Human Services Exploration: DSS Caseworker (NC FAST)

Human Services Exploration: DSS Caseworker is the first in a series of two classes offered through the NC FAST program. BOTH classes must be successfully completed in order to gain certification. In this course you will explore career expectations and employability skills for the role of Income Maintenance Caseworker within Division of Social Services Agencies. The second class is "HSE-3220: Income Maintenance Caseworker" and it will begin on March 14. This certification series is for students who are interested in working for the N.C. Department of Social Services as an Income Maintenance Caseworker.

Income Maintenance Caseworker (NC FAST)

Income Maintenance Caseworker – NC FAST is the second in a series of two classes offered through the NC FAST program. BOTH classes must be successfully completed in order to gain certification. This course is designed to cover a variety of skills associated with the Income Maintenance Caseworker role to process NC FAST applications and determine service eligibility. The prerequisite for this class is "HRD-4000: Human Services Exploration: DSS Caseworker." This certification series is for students who are interested in working for the N.C. Department of Social Services as an Income Maintenance Caseworker.

Industrial Electrical Maintenance

Students will learn the fundamentals of electricity and use of basic electrical equipment in an industrial environment.

Industrial Electrical Maintenance Level 2

Level 2 is designed for students who have completed Industrial Electrical Maintenance to expand knowledge and skills with basic electrical print reading, intro to programmable logic controllers (PLC), basic electrical troubleshooting, and variable frequency drives.

Manufacturing Production Technician NEW

Students will gain knowledge and skills required for employment as an entry level Manufacturing Production Technician. The program focuses on four major areas of instruction: Safety, Manufacturing Processes and Production, Quality Practices and Measurement and Maintenance Awareness. Students will earn the National Career Readiness Certificate, National Manufacturing Skills Standards Council (MSSC) Credential and OSHA 10 for General Industry.



Welding Classes: Before the class begins, students must have the following equipment: Welding helmet, gloves, welding sleeves or welding jacket, welding pliers, safety glasses, and closed-toe shoes (preferably leather).

Welding for Beginners

Welding for Beginners provides instruction on the principles and practices of welding, with an emphasis on SMAW (stick) and GMAW (MIG) welding. Upon completion, students will have the knowledge base to seek employment as a welder's helper.

Welding for Beginners – Level 2

Welding for Beginners – Level 2 is designed for students who have completed "Welding for Beginners" to continue instruction and skill development. The class will provide additional instruction on the principles and practices of welding, with emphasis on SMAW (stick) and GMAW (MIG) welding.

Welding for Beginners – Level 3

Welding for Beginners – Level 3 is designed for students who have completed "Welding for Beginners – Level 2" to continue instruction and skill development. This class will provide additional instruction on the principles and practices of welding, with an emphasis on GTAW welding. Students must have completed "Welding for Beginners" and "Level 2," or have previous welding experience to enroll.

Welding Applications in the Workplace **NEW!**

In Welding Applications in the Workplace, students will integrate knowledge and skills learned in Welding for Beginners Levels 1, 2, and 3 and learn to apply those skills in the workplace. Includes information such as using prints to build weldments. Incorporates application for one or more national certifications as well as soft skills which will help you advance in the workplace.

BLET - Basic Law Enforcement Training

The Basic Law Enforcement Training curriculum utilizes state commission-mandated topics and methods of instruction. General subjects include, but are not limited to, criminal, juvenile, civil, traffic, and alcohol beverage laws; investigate, patrol, custody, and court procedures; emergency responses; and ethics and community relations.

Detention Officer Certification NEW

Detention Officer Certification is offered under the guidelines and requirements as set forth by North Carolina Sheriffs' Education and Training Standards Commission. All persons who are employed as detention officers at local confinement facilities are required by the Sheriffs' Education and Training Standards Commission or the Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission to successfully complete this course.

NEW Detention Officer Certification

This is a 180 contact hour course for detention officers.

This certification-related Detention Officer Certification Course (DOCC) is offered under guidelines and requirements as set forth by North Carolina Sheriffs' Education and Training Standards Commission. Trainees must successfully pass State administered exam as well as demonstrate competency in all skill areas in order to be eligible for certification as a detention officer. Lecture, demonstrations and practical exercises are primary methods of instruction.

All persons who are employed as detention officers at local confinement facilities and are required by the Sheriffs' Education and Training Standards Commission or the Criminal Justice Education and Training Standards Commission to successfully complete this course.

ACLS Instructor

This is the classroom component that must be completed to become an ACLS instructor. For information on the complete requirements to become an American Heart Association Instructor, please visit: <u>http://www.heart.org</u> and follow the link for Instructors and Training Centers.

ACLS - Advanced Cardiac Life Support

ACLS is an advanced, Instructor-led classroom course that highlights the importance of team dynamics and communication, systems of care and immediate post--cardiac-arrest care. It also covers airway management and related pharmacology. In this course, skills are taught in large, group sessions and small, group learning and testing stations where case-based scenarios are presented. Pre-payment and pre-registration is required no later than three business days prior to the class. NC fee exempt status does apply.

BLS Instructor - Basic Life Support Instructor

This is the classroom component that must be completed to become a CPR instructor. For information on the complete requirements to become an American Heart Association Instructor, please visit: http://www.heart.org and follow the link for Instructors and Training Centers. NC fee exempt status does apply.

CPR (American Heart Association Basic Life Support Health Care Provider Course)

CPR Classes teach students how to recognize an emergency, care for conscious and unconscious choking victims, recognize signs of a heart attack, rescue breathing and cardiopulmonary resuscitation. This course also provides an introduction to automated external defibrillation and is approved by American Heart Association. When the course is completed, students receive an AHA/BLS recognition card that is valid for 2 years. No fee exemptions. CPR card fee is included in the cost. Prepayment and Pre-registration is required no later than one business week prior to class. AHA CPR Cards are now eCards, you must have an email address to access your card. **Start Local. CPR Skills Only eLearning Skills Practice and Testing/Approx. 1 hour

Are you seeking an alternative to classroom training or wishing to renew an existing AHA certification? The eLearning online course offers a flexible training option. The online cognitive portion, provided by AHA, allows students to complete learning at their own pace and convenience. Students should schedule a Skills Practice and Testing session prior to taking the on-line cognitive portion. Once students complete the on-line cognitive portion they should attend their scheduled hand-on skills practice and testing session to complete their certification. During this session students will have the opportunity for one-on-one practice before a skill tests with a certification in the associated discipline. The student will need to bring the eLearning certificate to the appointment along with a valid email address for the certificate. AHA CPR Cards are now eCards, you MUST have an email address to access your card. Appointment times are Monday and Wednesday 9-5; Tuesday and Thursday 9-7 and Friday 9-12. Appointments will be given in one hour increments.

First Aid

The American Heart Association HeartSaver First Aid is a classroom, video-based, instructor-led course that teaches students critical skills to respond to and manage an emergency in the first few minutes until emergency services (EMS) arrives. Students also learn skills such as how to treat bleeding, sprains, broken bones, shock and other first aid emergencies. When the course is completed, students receive an AHA First Aid recognition card that is valid for 2 years.

PALS - Pediatric Advanced Life Support

This classroom, video-based, Instructor-led course uses a series of simulated pediatric emergencies to reinforce the important concepts of a systematic approach to pediatric assessment, basic life support, PALS treatment algorithms, effective resuscitation and team dynamics. The goal of the Pediatric Advanced Life Support Course is to improve the quality of care provided to seriously ill or injured children, resulting in improved outcomes. Pre-payment and pre-registration is required no later than three business days prior to the class.

Cardiovascular Technician

This course is designed to prepare students to become a certified EKG Technicians and to gain employment.

Students will learn the anatomy and physiology of the heart, principles of EKG, dysrhythmia recognition of sinus, junctional/atrial rhythms, heart blocks and bundle branches, and ventricular ectopy rhythms. Students will build skills in operating EKG equipment, including running and mounting strips, reading and interpreting 22 types of cardiac lead tracings produced from 12-lead and 5-lead monitors, and understanding the basics of capnography as it relates to heart function.

This course will prepare students for the Certified EKG Technician (CET) Exam through the National Healthcareer Association (NHA).

Emergency Medical Technician Initial

The EMT program is designed to teach basic life support skills. EMTs are able to function in many areas including EMS systems, fire departments, hospitals, rescue squads and physician offices. The class consists of lectures and hands-on skills instruction as well as field clinical opportunities. Upon successful completion of this course, students will be eligible to sit for the North Carolina or National Registry EMT examination. See descriptions below for dates and times. Prices below include tuition as well as additional fees of Clinical uniform shirts, HCP CPR card fee and Malpractice Insurance. Textbook and workbooks are required; contact the bookstore to purchase. North Carolina tuition exemption status does apply, however additional fees and books are up to the individual.

Paramedic I & II

The paramedic course is designed to produce competent entry-level Paramedics who can provide treatment to the community in emergency situations. Paramedics assess the urgent needs of patients and stabilize their conditions until they receive definitive care. This treatment includes advanced life support, advanced patient assessment, airway management, pharmacological interventions and critical decision making.

Sustainable Trail Skills Training Sequence

Duke Energy TRAILS at Rockingham Community College has developed a sustainable trail skills training sequence of classes for varying skill levels, interests, and needs. Several courses are offered in two formats to meet student needs and time availability.

Single day classes provide basic information specific to the course title. Multiple day classes provide the same information as the single day classes listed under them and often include additional topics and fieldwork. Lecture, discussion, and experiential activities/fieldwork are combined to help students completely comprehend the course content.

Additional courses will be added in the future based on demand. If your agency or organization has specific trail skills training needs, we can create and schedule a program that meets your needs.

These classes are beneficial for anyone that has an interest in or is responsible for managing natural surface multiple-use trails. These trail skills will enhance the overall skill sets of staff from federal, state, and local government land management agencies; non-profit land conservancies; planning, parks and recreation, and maintenance departments; trail crew leaders, members, and volunteers.

Basic Trail Training - These classes are appropriate for any individuals who will be involved in the planning and design, construction, maintenance, and management of natural surface multiple-use trails. While not always required, the basic trail training classes will provide the ideal background for intermediate and advanced trail training.

Sustainable Trail Layout, Construction, and Maintenance (25 hours)

Sustainable Trail Planning, Design, and Layout (8 hours) Sustainable Trail Construction with Hand Tools (8 hours) Sustainable Trail Maintenance (8 hours)

Intermediate Trail Training - These classes are appropriate for individuals who may be involved in the conceptual planning, assessment, permitting, and contracting of natural surface multiple-use trails. Individuals in management roles who work with trail staff and professionals will benefit from the information offered in these classes.

Participants must dress appropriately for trail courses long pants and closed-toe shoes (boots preferred). Participants should bring their own snacks, and plenty of drinking water.

Students must dress appropriately for trail work - gloves, safety glasses, long pants, and closed-toe shoes (boots preferred). Students should bring their own lunch, snacks, and plenty of drinking water.

Intermediate Trail Assessment

During this two-day intermediate trail training session, participants will build on the skills and knowledge they gained in the sustainable trail assessment class. This class will focus on a critical assessment of a trail or trail system in the area. Participants will also discuss creating a trail assessment document to present findings and proposed recommendations. A majority of class time will be spent in the field. Students should have a thorough understanding of sustainable trails and trail assessment experience before taking this class.

Intermediate Trail Planning, Design, and Layout Field Experience

During this two-day intermediate trail training session, participants will build on the skills and knowledge they gained in the sustainable trail planning, design, and layout class. Small class size and focused fieldwork will allow participants to receive guided instruction with a majority of class time spent in the field. Students should have a thorough understanding of sustainable trail planning, design, and layout before taking this class.

Spring Foraging Series – Eat the Weeds

Each monthly session will focus on at least five different wild plant species that are currently ready for harvest as the seasons progress and change. A combination of class lecture and field identification/collection will provide an in-depth look at the selected species, potential look-a-likes, and preparation for consumption. Students will also discuss laws and personal safety guidelines for wild-crafting food and medicine for personal use. At the end of each session, students will be expected to properly identify selected plants and potential look-a-likes and harvest responsibly and safely. Participants will also be provided recipes for each wild plant species to take home, and try first hand. Students should dress appropriately and bring bug spray.

Sustainable Trail Design and Layout, Construction, and Maintenance

During this four-day basic trail training session, participants will learn how to design, layout, construct, and maintain sustainable trails. Classroom teaching and experiential learning will be combined to help students understand the fundamentals of sustainable trails.

Trail Planning for Local Governments

During this brief intermediate trail training session, students will learn the basics of large scale trail planning. Topics include conceptual trail planning, connectivity, landowner outreach, and grants. Participants will have the opportunity to discuss current and future trail projects within their jurisdictions.

Sustainable Trail Management

During this one-day intermediate trail training session, participants will learn about the comprehensive management of natural surface trails. Students will discuss trail assessment, maintenance schedules, wet weather trail maintenance, trail facilities, signage, and current issues in the management of natural surface trails. Fieldwork will include a site visit to a local trail system to evaluate sustainable trail management topics. Participants must dress appropriately for hiking.

Sustainable Trail Assessment, Permitting, and Contracting

During this three-day intermediate trail training session, participants will learn how to take a critical look at trails to assess condition, maintenance, and safety. Students will also discuss potential permitting requirements and trail contracting for natural surface sustainable trail projects. Classroom teaching and experiential learning will be combined to help students understand trail assessment, permits, and contracts.

Sustainable Trail Construction with Mechanized Equipment

During this three-day advanced trail training session, participants will gain an introduction into the world of mechanized trail building. Students will train on a variety of mini-excavators and a Sutter trail dozer. Small class size and focused fieldwork will allow participants to receive guided instruction in the field. Individuals should have prior experience with basic, intermediate, and advanced trail skills.

Wilderness First Aid


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
