PHYSICAL RESOURCES: The Rockingham Community College (RCC) campus located in Wentworth, NC, owns and operates approximately 233,851 assignable square feet of space in 20 buildings occupying about one-third of the college's 266 acres of property owned. The buildings contain a total of 64 classrooms and 45 labs. In addition to educational facilities, RCC benefits from athletic facilities and areas for expansion with natural wooded areas, ponds, and streams.

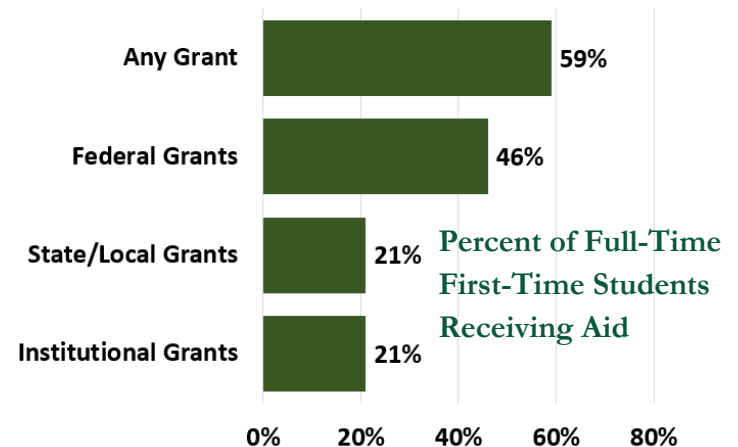
