Comments:

- Dialysis technician requirements vary by state and other individual factors which may include credentials, training, job experience, criminal history, or military service.
- The standardized requirements across all 50 states for the dialysis technician are set by Medicare and Medicaid. While most dialysis technicians seek voluntary certification, states may require to be registered with the state or have additional training. Formal dialysis technician training programs are available from community colleges, vocational schools, technical institutes, and dialysis facilities.
- Formal dialysis technician training and additional work experience of 6 months or 1,000 hours of on-the-job training may lead to either a certificate or a diploma. They do not confer any type of licensed dialysis technician. Dialysis technicians <u>are not</u> required by law to hold licensure or certification.
- Students may be required to pass a background and drug screening in addition to certification, licensing, and or state registration for more information review state laws.
