CCP Q&A

1.) Q: WHAT IS CCP?

A: NC Career and College Promise (CCP) is a state program that offers eligible high school students structured opportunities to enroll in pathways that lead to a certificate, diploma or degree as well as provide Entry–level job skills.

2.) Q: WHAT IS THE COST?

A: The program is tuition free. Unless other provisions are made, students and parents pay for fees, books and other materials required for class. <u>Fees must be paid each semester the student is enrolled.</u> All students pay technology, CAPs (campus access parking and security) fees. Student insurance and Credential Fees are based on the program. Fees are paid in the RCC Business Office.

3.) Q: ARE SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE FOR TEXTBOOKS?

A: When funds are available information on how to apply is included in mailer with RCC schedule. Due to a grant with Rockingham County Schools, books will be provided for RCS (McMichael, Morehead, Reidsville, and Rockingham) students during the 2023-2024 academic year. In either case, fees are still the responsibility of the parent and student.

4.) Q: IS BUS TRANSPORTATION PROVIDED?

A: No. If a school decides to provide transportation, students at that school will be notified.

5.) Q: CAN MY CHILD JUST ENROLL IN COLLEGE CLASSES?

A: No, Students must be enrolled in high school and making progress toward graduation.

6.) Q: HOW ARE CLASSES STRUCTURED?

A: Each instructor designs his/her class. For each class there will be a syllabus that contains information about attendance, assignments, due dates, etc. It is the student's responsibility to follow the academic policies stated on the syllabus.

7.) Q: WHICH CALENDAR DOES MY CHILD FOLLOW?

A: Students must follow both the high school and RCC calendar. When high school is closed and RCC is open, students are responsible for attending class.

8.) Q: WHAT IF MY CHILD MISSES CLASS?

A: Class attendance is crucial to success. Please refer to each class syllabus for information on attendance policies. Students must always inform the RCC faculty.

9.) Q: WHAT IF MY CHILD CAN'T ATTEND CLASS DURING INCLEMENT WEATHER?

A: Student safety is always first. Students should email faculty and director/academic advisor to make them aware. This should occur anytime they are unable to attend class.

10.) Q: HOW ARE EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES HANDLED?

A: On rare occasions sports, field trips, competitions, etc. may occur during college class time. Students should notify instructor in advance. They may be required to provide documentation and make up time or assignments.

11.) Q: IN JANUARY, HS FINAL EXAMS OCCUR DRING THE FIRST WEEK OF RCC CLASSES. WHAT SHOULD WE DO?

A: Students should inform instructor, HS counselor and director/academic advisor of any conflicts. Both RCS and RCC are aware of overlaps. Students will not be penalized for missing the first day of class.

12.) Q: CAN I CALL INSTRUCTORS TO ASK QUESTIONS OR INQUIRE ABOUT MY CHILD'S STATUS IN CLASS?

A: No. Due to FERPA (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act), instructors cannot discuss anything without student consent. Students should see director/academic advisor to sign consent form. For more information on FERPA policy refer to: http://www.rockinghamcc.edu/records-office/ferpa-policy

13.) Q: WHO DO I CALL IF I HAVE CONCERNS?

A: First point of contact is director/academic advisor.

14.) Q: MY CHILD HAS AN IEP. CAN HE/SHE RECEIVE ACCOMODATIONS?

A: Students in need of accommodations must contact the Accessibility Counselor to schedule a meeting. Additional paperwork will be required.

15.) Q: IS THERE TUTORING AVAILABLE?

A: Yes, the Academic Resource Center (ARC) is available to all students.

16.) Q: HOW DO STUDENTS RECEIVE GRADES?

A: RCC instructors send final grades to Director of Educational Partnerships who sends grades to high schools. High schools post grades to the student report card. Each homeschool functions independently. Grades are sent if requested.

17.) Q: HOW DOES MY CHILD REQUEST A RCC TRANSCRIPT?

A: When applying to college, students will need a transcript from the high school and RCC. To obtain the RCC transcript visit:

https://www.rockinghamcc.edu/admissions-aid/transcripts/. The current fee is \$5.00.

18.) Q: HOW DO STUDENTS WITHDRAW FROM CLASS?

A: Because RCC classes are covering a high school block and sometimes a graduation requirement, student must discuss withdrawal request with their high school counselor/principal. If approved to withdraw, students complete the drop form in Etrieve Central. Directions on how to complete the form may be obtained from HS Counselor or Director/Academic Advisor.

19. Q: WHAT IS THE ROCKINGHAM PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP?

A: Two years of free in-state tuition and fees at RCC for eligible graduates of a Rockingham County School (McMichael, Morehead, Reidsville and Rockingham) Eligibility includes completion of three CCP classes with grades of C or better and a HS unweighted GPA of 2.5 or better.
